H.A.R.D. BOARD OF DIRECTORS' BI-MONTHLY MEETING *Actions and Calendar of Upcoming Events*

Hayward, CA (Tuesday, October 27, 2015)

The Hayward Area Recreation and Park District (H.A.R.D.) conducted its Board of Directors' meeting on Monday, October 26, 2015. The following action was taken:

- Awarded Monthly Volunteer Recognition Award for October 2015 to Mr. Bill Teefy who works at the East Avenue Summer Camp Program.
- Approved rejection of the claim under the provisions of Government Code Section 912.6.
- Accepted the lowest qualified bid of \$690,012 submitted by Southland Construction of Pleasanton for the Sorensdale Recreation Center Multi-Purpose Room and Restroom Renovation project contingent upon receiving Performance and Payment Bonds.
- Authorized Locker Room Improvement funds not to exceed \$37,000 for the purchase and installation of locker room equipment for the downstairs locker rooms at the Hayward Plunge.
- Approved adopting a resolution requesting a tax advance from Alameda County in the amount of four million five hundred thousand dollars (\$4,500,000) in order to meet District financial obligations.
- Appointment of Mr. Victor Chacon from Custodial to the position of Custodial Foreman in the Recreation Department at a monthly salary of \$4,257 per month effective November 1, 2015.
- Accepted Grounds Foreman, Mr. Marco Hernandez', request for retirement effective December 31, 2015.
- Adopted resolution in support of the proposed collaboration with CVUSD for athletic field improvements.
