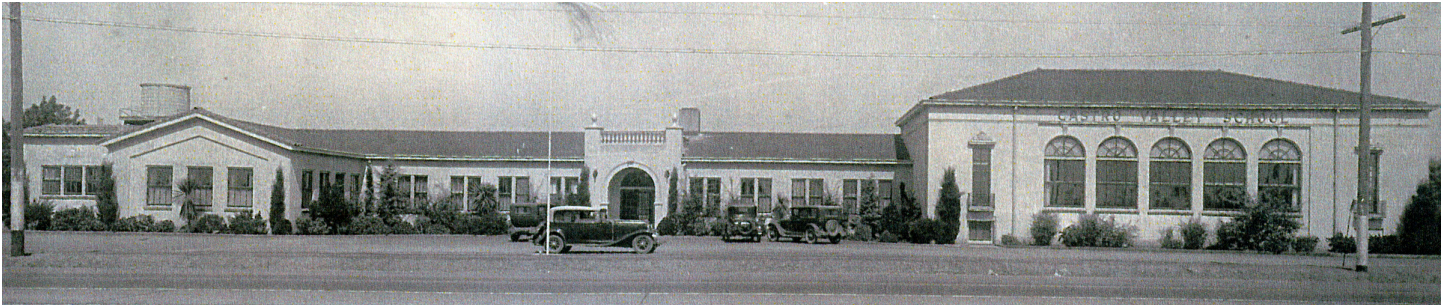


Lucille Lorge and Randy Vanderbilt present

These fifteen minutes of film are selected outtakes of a collection of several hours of film that have been recently discovered and edited together for your enjoyment.
